1. Motivation behind Research Paper

Also, we thought that this project would contribute to conservation because we distributed notebooks which had been abandoned, so we could save paper, reduce trash and help the environment. However, we could give people some abandoned books and we thought that this result was more significance.

4. Conclusion and Future Problems
